



School Uniform

The uniform is a practical set of clothes suited to life at school. It underlines the idea that the child is coming to school wearing special clothes ready for work. It is a form of self-discipline, not a fashion statement. The uniform also helps develop the idea of belonging to a community.

All school uniform, including the PE kit, should be named.

Girls:

- Grey culottes, skirt, pinafore, trousers.
 - White blouse & green/gold tie *
 - White polo Shirt(without a tie) *
 - Green and White striped/checked dress
 - Bottle-green jumper, cardigan/sweatshirt *
 - White socks, grey/bottle green tights
 - Sensible shoes, i.e. no raised heels
slung backs, trainers
 - School ski hat *
 - School base-ball cap *
- N.B. Skirts/dresses/pinafores/culottes should be knee length.
This is practical for the varied activities during the school day.

Boys:

- Grey Trousers or shorts
- White shirt with Green/Gold tie *
- White polo shirt * (without a tie)
- Bottle-green jumper or sweatshirt *
- School base-ball cap *
- Grey socks
- Sensible shoes ~ not trainers
- School ski hat *

PE kit for boys and girls:

- Navy/Black or (White shorts*) and t-shirt *
- Plimsolls
- Trainers may be worn by pupils in Oak & Elm classes for some games activities
- Track suits may be worn for games, during cold winter weather, by all pupils
- Swimming costume or trunks *not shorts* (as required), swimming hat ~ boys & girls
- Boys and girls should attend school with their hair in an appropriate style
- Girls with long hair should wear it tied back, as simply and securely as possible at all times during the school day
- **The PE kit should be kept in school all week, in a named PE bag ~ no plastic bags please**
- Children should not bring large sports bags to school
- All articles of school uniform or PE kit should be named
