Dear Parents and Carers

This is our first newsletter of 2020, so happy new year everyone and I hope it is the very best year for you and your families!

The end of last year was exceptionally busy with the panto, Christmas fair, Christmas lunch, nativity, federation carols and so on – the beginning of the year has been no different and proves to continue to be equally busy! Check out the diary dates at the end of this newsletter to see what is coming up.

### Federation News – Broad Oak CP School

Last week Broad Oak year 3 and 4 children, parents and staff were interviewed and filmed by the BBC for a political show which aired on Sunday 19th January. If you missed it, it can be found on BBC 1 i-player and search for 'Politics South East' show. The program highlighted the continued challenge facing small rural schools and how lack of government funding is causing school budgets to go into deficit. The new national funding formula is not going to help small rural schools and is in fact going to make them worse off. This includes Dallington and Punnetts Town schools.

The final statutory consultation is now running for Broad Oak School as ESCC still seeks to close our sister school. Governors have put together a proposal which shows no deficit from the federation budget in 2019-2020, 2020-21 and only a small deficit in 2021-2022. This is a very different projection to the one in the ESCC closure proposal. Broad Oak has been hit particularly hard since the consultation being announced in June 2019 and ESCC admit that the process is responsible for pupils leaving the school since that time and few joining. However pupils continue to join Broad Oak school with eight having joined since July 2019 despite the projected future for the school. When families visit the school at Broad Oak they fall in love with it and have been delighted with the provision for their children. The school is awaiting the next Ofsted section 5 visit which is an inspection which should change the rating from 'requires improvement' to 'good'. The governors are sure the school is a 'good' school now and the recent league tables show that to be so with Broad Oak being ranked 50<sup>th</sup> out of 100 East Sussex schools for progress and 2<sup>nd</sup> out of the nine Heathfield area schools for progress in end of KS2 Reading and Maths SATs papers.

Please use the information below to write to Stuart Gallimore about the benefits of small schools, the local community and the importance of Broad Oak as part of our federation and community. Broad Oak School provides good education, meets the needs of all pupils well, especially SEND pupils, and is the heart of Broad Oak community. The consultation closes at midnight on 6<sup>th</sup> February 2020. Please tell all your friends and neighbours to do the same and share the information widely.
