## Beech class



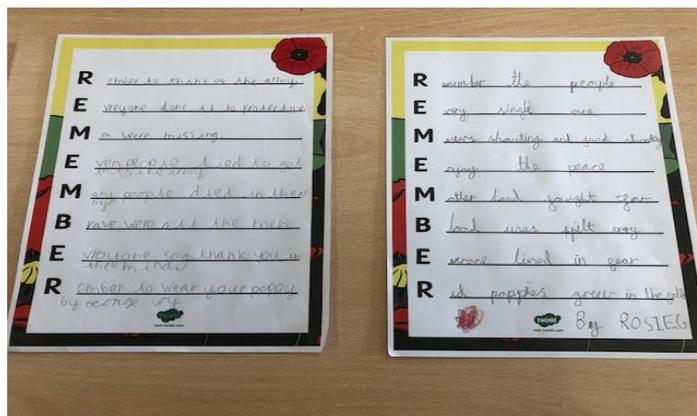
Beech class topic this term is 'Once upon a time'
