



Beech class


What a strange period of time this has been! Beech class have been learning at home using Google Classroom. It has been lovely to see their smiling faces each morning and they have all been working very hard on the work that has been set.

Year 1 children have been learning alternative spellings of some sounds we have already learnt such as 'oo' which can also be 'ew'; 'oa can also be 'oe' and 'ph' is also 'f/ff'. They have been challenged to learn 10 new 'tricky' words before we return to school next week! Their literacy lessons have been all about Jack and The Beanstalk. I am looking forward to reading all your sentences Year 1! Maths is all about subtraction at the moment and finding out the different ways it can be done e.g. counting back; finding the difference or finding a part.





Reception children have been learning new sounds 'r'; 'h'; 'b' and 'f'; they have also been listening to a song about the 'tricky' words I, no, go, to and the. Some children have then been 'word detectives' and tried to spot them in their reading books! For maths they have looked at numbers 3, 4 and 5 so far. They have used objects to represent the number and some have tried to write it too.
