Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to our new term. It has certainly been another busy and eventful start!

Thank you for your continued support to help us monitor and manage the ongoing pandemic. For the last two weeks we have continued to work in class bubbles and this will continue into next week as well. We hope to limit contact so Christmas can be enjoyed again as a school.
