

## Elm Class Year 6 Term 3

English: We will be researching and learning how to write a non-chronological report on emperor penguins and then move on to writing a non-chronological report based on an animal of our choice from Antarctica or the Arctic. We will also learn about the shape of a diary entry using the book *Scott of the Antarctic*. We will continue to extend our understanding of sentence structure and grammar and applying learnt spelling rules. We will enjoy developing our understanding and love of reading through our class text 'The Wolf Wilder' by Katherine Rundell.



Maths: We will learn to add and subtract mixed numbers, multiply and divide fractions, use BIDMAS, calculate a fraction of an amount and be able to add, subtract, multiply and divide decimal numbers up to three decimal places and continue to work on our speed of recall of times table facts.



Geography: We will be mapping the Arctic and the Antarctic; researching and comparing the similarities and difference: of both Polar Regions; discover the effects of climate change and find out about the indigenous people and their traditions/ways of life.



PSHE: We will be developing our understanding regarding setting personal goals and recognising and celebrating our sense of self.



RE: We will be learning about Good Friday and the resurrection of Jesus.



Computing: We will investigate how we can keep ourselves safe when using technology, carry out research safely and effectively online and plan and present our work online.


History: We will learn about some famous explorers and about the sinking of the Titanic.
