# **Working Hard on Science in Hazel class!**

We have started learning about plants and discussed what we already knew about them. We then looked at different plants, looking closely at the roots, stem, leaves and flowers. We even found some wildlife had come into the classroom with the plants and meant we could discuss the role of plants had on the wildlife.







We then designed our own experiment to prove what roots do and wondered if roots get more water if there are lots of little roots or whether a plant would get more water if there was just one root. Hazel class split into groups and were given different sizes of cotton wool to represent roots. Some groups kept their cotton wool as a lump and other groups pulled the wool into lots of strands that looked like roots. We then took turns to put water on the cotton wool from a syringe and recorded our results. We had to use our Math's skills to measure the size of the cotton wool and measure the water in the syringe. Next week we are going to compare our results and see if we can prove our predictions.





Hazel class are going to use what we have learnt about plants to make up a dance about the life cycle of a plant. We look forward to showing you it once completed.

In Geography we have been thinking about the weather and climate and what each term means. We thought about the different weather types we have in England and other weather we know of in other countries like tornados.
