#### **Hazel Class News**



In Hazel class we have been learning about Friction in our Science lessons. The children really enjoyed carrying out an investigation to see if the surface type made a difference to the distance a toy car travelled. We learnt that water can create a barrier between the car and the road and reduces friction. We also thought about last term's Geography lessons where we learnt about Monsoons. We found out from the internet that more car accidents happen in Monsoon season in other countries for this very reason.



In PSHE we have been learning about our rights and responsibilities and how to keep ourselves safe. The children really enjoyed the practical activities which underpin very important knowledge. We made hands with a red and green side to show our understanding of what is safe and appropriate and what might make us feel unsafe or uncomfortable.





Over the last few weeks in our Art lessons we have been learning how to create a Monochrome landscape. This involves using only ONE base colour! The children were amazed at how they could create different shades and tones in this way, which reflect the simplicity of the landscape. The results were truly amazing. We were so happy with them we decided to extend this task to make silhouettes and a 3-D frame. We were very grateful for parents help (and staff!) who provided us with empty cereal packets. The children really enjoyed the final outcome.





One of the highlights of our last term has been our English lessons. We have been reading the Crow's Tale which the children loved. We have been plotting the highs and lows of the story on a timeline, which has helped us map out the key events. We particularly enjoyed working with drama to act out scenes to help us to write in more detail. We then wrote our very own



story. Hazel's stories were so good we read them to Beech and Elm. This was a lovely opportunity to share our success with the wider school community. We made the stories into small booklets with a front over and even a synopsis at the back! Well done Hazel class.
