Dear Parents and Carers,

#### Oak class: Oak class are having an electrifying time!

Oak class Science learning this term is electricity. We have looked at what uses and needs electricity and this week we made a basic circuit. We then had to decide whether the symbols that we were shown would make a working circuit or not and give good reasons for our answers.



We have also been learning about Ancient civilisations and Ancient Egypt. We found out about lots of different Ancient civilisations and then had to put them in chronological order as well as put them on a time line. This took a lot of thought! Oak class then looked at different real Ancient Egyptian artefacts and thought what they might be. We hope to have an Ancient Egypt day soon (date to be confirmed for Term 6!).







We have also been working on learning about shapes and angles. Year 3's can turn in different amounts and Year 4 can now correctly use the terms, acute and obtuse angles.
