The children enjoyed meeting the members of the group and experienced an afternoon of 'Hand on History'. This was chosen as an area to support the children's learning of their focus around castles and medieval times. The children and staff were certainly amazed by the facts and experiences they had with the armour, swords and bow and arrows!



Oak class: Egyptian Day: An Amazing Egyptian Day was had by all!



Oak class have been working hard learning all about Ancient Egypt. On Tuesday we had an Ancient Egyptian day where we dressed up and then made Canopic jars out of clay. We had to work hard to make the jar, write on it in hieroglyphics and then make a lid that fitted with an Egyptian God's head on top.

We also used our learning in Science and making circuits to make a tomb with traps set off by buzzers. We had to work in groups of 3, design a tomb and then make it out of a box while working together.



Pupil voice was collected to summarise the day: **Lola:** "we have made lots of Canopic jars, they were great to make, you had to be really careful". **Daisy:** "we made a tomb and it was lots of fun, we had to think about where to place things and what would be needed in a tomb". **Mia:** "I really liked making the Canopic jars, it was good fun and you had to shape it carefully". **Harriet:** "it was hard to make the Canopic jars, but I got there in the end". **Joey:** "I liked working with the clay, I made a great



jar and the head was part man and part animal".

Year 6: Bike-ability: Last week some year six children took part in Bike-ability; we learnt how to signal using our arms and to check if our bikes are road worthy. It was fun when we did the snake game which involved having a leader and following them around the playground. We practiced emergency breaking to ensure we can keep ourselves safe whilst riding.
