This year the Federation has decided to issue written school reports, for Y1-Y6, at the end of term 4 (just before Easter). Teachers have to produce a written report once a year and we feel that half way through the year provides teachers the opportunity to celebrate the success and achievements

your child has made so far and also provides the opportunity to identify areas within the school year that may need further development. As always there will be an opportunity to meet with teachers on receipt of your child's report. The final parent consultation will then take place in the final summer term, where we will then welcome your feedback alongside the teachers.

Thank you for your continued support in managing attendance. It is vitally important that if pupils are too ill to be in school, that they remain at home, but we also need regular attendance. The school as a whole is doing well but our overall percentage has fallen to 94.5%. The target is 96%.

The government have just launched a new initiative of 'Moments matter, attendance counts'. Obviously, we all interpret this in our own ways but if I liken attendance to a favourite TV program (before Catch up TV etc!): if I miss 10 minutes I can generally catch up, if I miss 30 minutes I can still understand but know I have missed out on some key points and if I miss an episode or more I really don't know what is happening and become disengaged. Please continue to work with us and talk to us about any concerns you have.
