
We have 103 pupils on roll (school aged) and 23 currently on roll for our school nursery.


15 pupils are currently in Year 6 and will leave in July 2024

The children are taught to be reflective in the choices they make and in their formal learning.


- The children learn to work together and listen to feedback to improve further.


