Beech Class: It's been a busy term so far in Beech!



We have introduced Drawing club to support the children with their vocabulary and writing. The children have been very imaginative with their drawings taking the adventure further with exciting scenarios and codes and special words for their drawings to do something unexpected and exciting!

In Phonics the children continue to recap sounds learnt so far and also letter orders. They have been practising their high frequency words, both verbally and in writing.



In maths the children have been working on number order and composition, using some great subsidising skills and number knowledge. Most recently the children have started to look at number comparison focusing on doubles.

The children have also been enjoying leaning all about Jungles and Rainforests, learning the differences between living there and living in the UK, Jungle sounds and using their crafted binoculars to spot jungle animals.



In Art and Design we have used our Jungles and Rainforest topic to theme what we have made. The children have made some

amazing Jungle animal sculptures using influence of Barbara Hepworth. In addition the children have completed junk modelling creating jungle trees and their own pair of binoculars.
