Dear Parents and Carers,

What a sensational term! I am delighted to share that the school was visited by the Healthy Schools team on Tuesday this week. We achieved Healthy Schools status a couple of years ago and this was the follow up visit to see that practice was embedded and had continued to evolve.

Reviewing evidence based on 4 key areas: SEMH (Social, Emotional, and Mental Health), Healthy Eating, PSHE (Personal, Social and Health Education including SRE and drugs education) and Physical

Activity, the team reported practice is embedded, that the school is inclusive and everyone is invested, with the wellbeing of everyone at the centre of practice. Children are happy, caring and friendly. Children are important, they are listened to and their views considered and the children talked about school positively and they know who to talk to and how to address worries. There is no lid on the opportunities and aspirations for all which has a positive impact on the school. The school has a strong team who work well and are committed. As you can imagine we are immensely proud of our achievements. Thank you to the staff for their continued hard work, and

thank you to the children who make our jobs so fulfilling. Finally to you as parents and carers who support us all.
