

Support: Thank you to the parents who attended the Y4 Multiplication Check session last week. The Y4 children will complete this assessment during the first two weeks of term 6, so please keep practicing times tables during the half term. In addition the Year 1 pupils will complete their Phonics Screening again, on our return in term 6. Please continue to support your child using Phonics Shed to reinforce their Phonics knowledge and early reading.

Thank you to all of the parent drivers who have been helping with transport to the various activities and events we have been able to send pupils too. We know the impact this has on your already busy lives, but also know the positive impact and enrichment this has on your child's development as a young person. This is certainly extending opportunities and keeping costs to a minimum, thank you.

Everyone has been enthusiastically practising the Shepherd's Hey country dance and the Barbers Pole Maypole dance ready for their public performance yesterday. At the beginning of the week, Hazel Class were very lucky to go on a daytrip to Hastings Old Town. The wonderfully sunny day commenced with a talk at the Life Boat Station, followed by an opportunity to have a look at the Life Boat. Next, they went to the Hastings Aquarium. Everyone loved hearing about the rescued puffer fish and enjoyed walking through the underwater tunnel, where sharks and stingrays lurked in the darkness waiting to make them jump! Matthew said he especially enjoyed meeting a chameleon in the Reptile House, "the chameleon walked up to us and waved, and we all waved back!" A quick stop for lunch was followed by a beach break, with attempts made to throw stones into the sea. The final part of the trip was to the Fisherman's Museum, where the class all



clambered into a large, wooden boat in the centre of the museum. The children learned some maritime terminology – 'port', 'starboard', 'bow', 'stern', 'mast' and 'deck'. Do ask your child if they can remember what they all mean!

Each week the adults and children reflect in their classes and choose a member of the class to receive the 'Star of the week' certificate. I am pleased to share that in:


