We hope you had a lovely half term break. Welcome to our final school term of the academic year. The saying 'time flies when you're having fun' is certainly the phrase to encapsulate this year, which seems to have flown by. School is always busy and now term 6 is upon us. This is a term where we all prepare for the new academic year whilst enjoying the remaining 5 weeks of term. We will continue to add dates and times to the table at the end of the newsletter and will send reminders via Arbor so please update your calendars so you don't miss events.

On **Monday 17**th **June** we ask for your children from Reception through to Year 6 to wear their own clothes for our school house day. We have a variety of activities that all children will be participating in so please send your child to school in their own clothes that are suitable for PE, art and outdoor activities – thank you.

On **Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> June** we are being joined by many members of Dallington School. Both schools' Years 5 and 6 are off for their HASP Olympics Day, all sharing the same coach, which will be leaving Punnetts Town shortly after 9am. Years 1 and 2 are sharing their Federation Day at Punnetts Town. The car park will therefore be busier, so to try to alleviate this the school gates will open at 8.30am, so please consider coming slightly earlier to help us control the flow of traffic.

Arbor is now used for all communication. The office staff, Mrs Saunders and Mrs Venner will send 'In-app messages' which are used for direct messages, but anything that requires a document to be attached will be sent to your personal email account, the office will also send you an 'in-app' message to alert you to the email.

Parent Consultation meetings (Tuesday 18th June or Thursday 20th June) Please sign up on Arbor to meet with your child's class teacher for those in Year 1 to Year 6). This is a really valuable meeting for the teachers to celebrate your child's successes for the year. They will also share progress and attainment for the year and give ideas for how you can continue to support through the summer holidays. If you are unable to make the dates and times offered, please speak to your child's class teacher directly so all appointments are made.

**Sports Day** is quickly approaching (Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June with reserve date of Friday 5<sup>th</sup> July). Children are asked to wear their PE kit all day ideally with a coloured t-shirt to represent their house. All of the children from Nursery to Year 6 are in a school house team this is either blue, yellow, red or green (if your child is unsure please ask a member of staff in your child's class). PE kits will be sent home on the Thursday night in readiness for Friday. The format of the day:

9.15 – 11.30 Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and 2 on the field for a carousel of activities followed by a track race to finish the morning.

1.00 – 3.00 Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 variety of track events

This will all take place on the field opposite school. Please park carefully; leaving safe and clear access for the doctor's surgery, and park considerately of our neighbours this will be especially important due to the increase in the number of cars, Thank you.

Tri-Golf: On Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> June, the Years 3/4 tri-golf team went to Beacon Academy in Crowborough

for an afternoon of Tri-Golf with Mrs Ellin alongside other primary school teams. The children enjoyed developing their skills and playing some games in the sunshine. I am delighted to share that the children finished in 5<sup>th</sup> position (out of 8). Huge congratulations to the team!

**Little Punnetts:** We've had an exciting start to the term exploring the theme of "Art through the Ages" with our little artists. These are just a few of the things we have been up to.

Creative Models: Our children have been busy crafting unique models using various natural resources. From leaves and twigs to recycled materials, their creativity knows no bounds! The results have been truly amazing.

Forest School Adventure: During their first forest school session, the children explored the great outdoors. They learned about safety precautions while having a blast. Imagine their joy as they played animal games and mimicked the sounds of their favourite creatures!

Phonics Fun: In phonics, we've been diving into rhyming words. The children have been listening to simple stories and identifying rhymes. "Dog" and "fog" are just a couple of examples—they're becoming little wordsmiths!

Mathematical Explorations: Our maths adventures have focused on 2D shapes and number composition. The children are mastering these concepts, and their enthusiasm is contagious.

We started off by sketching out our bird of choice that can be found on the Cuckoo Trail after this we created a collage out of many pieces of colourful paper! We are very grateful that she was able to come in today and share her knowledge of art (and birds)



with us. Her favourite birds are pigeons and she very kindly left us her self-published book



containing many sketches and information on them. This workshop is in partnership with East Sussex to raise awareness of the Cuckoo trail. We learnt about its history and also how it got its name. 
