Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to our new school year; September 2024 – July 2025! Welcome to Punnetts Town!

A huge welcome to all of the children, and especially to those who are starting their nursery and reception school journey. The children have all done so well as we finish our first week of school. Punnetts Town is a wonderful school, which I thoroughly enjoy leading. The staff pride themselves in really developing strong relationships with all of the children, and knowing them well as individuals. We also know the importance of working closely with parents.

It has been wonderful to see how confidently the children have returned to school, thank you for supporting us in the mornings, with quick drop offs, to help the children settle and start their learning. It is always wonderful to hear all the news from the summer holidays and it certainly sounds like you have all enjoyed the last 6 weeks. Please remember to pass on any messages to myself or Mrs Saunders and we of course, will pass these onto the class teachers. If you do have any concerns, please raise these early, by talking to class teachers at the end of the school day or sending an email in via the school office.

We have welcomed two new members of staff; Mrs Sophie Field who will teach on Thursday and Friday in Hazel class and Miss Mia Hesling who will be working as part of the Early Years team. A separate 'Whos Who' sheet has been sent to you giving you information and photographs of the staffing structure and to help you familiarise yourselves with new staff teams. We hope you have been able to attend a Meet the teacher session this week. Just to remind you on Monday, 9<sup>th</sup> September, Mrs Smith for Oak class and Mrs Fletcher for Hazel class will repeat the sessions lead this week by their job shares. These sessions will run at 2.30pm and 3.20pm. We hope you have found these useful.

The teachers have shared their overview for the year ahead in their Meet the Teacher slides and additional documents will be sent via Arbor next week and will also be on our school website – please take time to read through these to help with the reinforcement of learning at home. We do ask that you regularly share books with your child at home, and record this in their reading record. It is so important to read regularly, and for children to see adults as positive reading role models. We also ask that you support your child's maths fluency skills, as suggested by class teachers, again this really helps build confidence, and knowledge which helps learning develop for your child. Little and often works, please find and prioritise some time.

School is always a busy place, and this has certainly been the case throughout the summer holiday as well. Huge thanks are extended to the staff who have worked above and beyond in our extensive move of all of the classrooms and additional work spaces. We have also started our regeneration of the outside space. The Millennium area, which has served the school well for the last 24 years, is currently out of use as the first stage of our plans. The ground is being cleared and the back section will create a new, year 6 area, whilst the front section will become a more natural area, providing a quiet and peaceful area for all pupils. In time, it will be useful to ask for parent support in helping prepare the ground, which we will be in contact about.

The outside gym, is still in current use, but will be taped off nearer the end of September as we start the replacement of key pieces of equipment and flooring. We ask that you ensure your children do not go in taped off areas, or use the outside gym at the end of the school days, because these areas have to be supervised by staff. Many thanks.

It is always lovely to hear from our local community who speak so positively of our pupils. I have been asked to remind parents and carers to be cautious on the pavements, crossing driveways and in the car park. With an increase in electric vehicles and the ongoing road works along Battle Road, we know how vehicles can appear, so please keep your children close to you, thank you.

Do you shop in Asda? If you do, please support the school. Asda currently have an incentive running 'Asda Rewards Cashpot for Schools'. It is linked to your own Asda rewards app, where you can select 'Schools in Need' and then a percentage of your spend will come to the school.

**Attendance:** You may have seen or heard on the news about the new regulations to support attendance in schools. Children should be in school for 190 days each academic year unless they are too unwell to be in school. Irregular attendance really impacts children's learning, wellbeing and opportunities. The new guidance, outlines how all schools will now manage withdrawal from learning applications:

By completing and submitting this form I understand that if the request is unauthorised the Legal Interventions Team at East Sussex County Council will be notified of the absence taken and a legal intervention may be instigated in the form of a Penalty Notice. I also understand that if a Penalty Notice is issued it will be to **each parent for each child taken out of school**. I also acknowledge the following:-

- A limit of no more than 2 penalty notices will be issued to the same parent for the same pupil within a 3-year rolling period will apply from 19 August 2024.
- The first penalty notice issued to the parent for that pupil will be charged at £160 if paid within 28 days reducing to £80 if paid within 21 days.
- Where it is deemed appropriate to issue a second penalty notice to the same parent for the same pupil within 3 years of the first notice, the second notice is charged at a flat rate of £160 if paid within 28 days.
- A third penalty notice will not be issued within a 3-year period. Therefore, in cases where the threshold is met for a third (or subsequent) times within those 3 years, a penalty notice cannot be issued, and alternative action will be taken instead. This will often include considering prosecution but may include other tools such as one of the other attendance legal interventions.

We will continue to report on weekly attendance in our newsletters and hope that our school target of 96% will be achieved this year.



#### Achievements out of school:

Huge congratulations to Joey. During the summer holidays he competed in Wales, over 3 days in the 10 & Under Championship at the Summer Championships. He finished in 9<sup>th</sup>, then 2<sup>nd</sup> then 1<sup>st</sup>! Joey also competed at Hickstead for the NSEA grass roots championships. He finished in 4<sup>th</sup> position qualifying to represent Punnetts Town School at the National Championships in October! Wow – fantastic riding skills Joey, well done.
