I am delighted to share our Ofsted outcome from our recent inspection on the 8th and 9th of October, 2024. As many of you know Ofsted have made changes to the way they inspect and report; one of the big changes is moving away from a one word overall judgement, instead there are words used from all of the areas inspected in school. I am immensely proud of the staff and pupils and thank all parents who took time to complete questionnaires and speak to the inspectors. Little Punnetts: Welcome back! We hope you had a wonderful half-term break! The children have settled back in beautifully and are excited about the term ahead. This term, we will be exploring Space, and the children have already shown an amazing interest and enthusiasm for the topic. We've been blown away by their impressive knowledge and curiosity about the universe!

We also kicked off with the children's first Forest School session, which was a great success! It was wonderful to see their engagement and excitement as they explored and learned in the natural environment.





Oak: On Tuesday 5th November Oak class went on a welly walk with Rachel Bennington. We have been learning about the Vikings and then going on to learn about the Anglo Saxons that lived before them. It was great fun walking down roads, through leaves, a stream, and fields. We stopped at many places and looked at the trees and how these would have been used to feed pigs and people during the Anglo Saxon times. What they would have done with nettles and other leaves and things we could eat. We also looked for animal footprints and then nuts and acorns. We then

choose 3 natural things to make a charm when we got back to school.

In the afternoon we had a handling session where we held animal skin that was used for paper, a coin and glass beads that Anglo Saxons would have.

We then used ink Rachel had made using Anglo Saxon ingredients to write using their letters.
