Little Punnetts class: We have had a busy term in Little Punnetts, exploring lots of different exciting topics. We celebrated the Chinese (Lunar) New Year where the children created their own Chinese lanterns and learnt all about the different traditions and that it is the year of the snake.

We have been embracing the cold weather by exploring all things winter. We have been dressing up warm and looking at the changes in weather. We learnt all about hibernation, the different animals that hibernate, and what they do to prepare for winter. The children have loved looking at the story "We're Going on a Bear Hunt" where we created our own bear hunt using different sensory materials.



Outdoor learning has been, wet, cold, dry, and sunny; regardless of the weather all the sessions were enjoyed. We learnt about habitats and attempted to create a nest – how a bird does this with its beak is incredible as we had great difficulty with two hands!

As scientists, we investigated a series of circuits and experimented with different amounts of voltage and in computing, we learnt how to program a micro: bit and create a step counter.
