Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you to the parents from Nursery and Reception for taking the time to meet with key staff to discuss your child's progress and attainment. The teachers from Year 1 to year 6 are currently completing written reports which will come to you in the last week of this term. There will be a letter that accompanies your child's yearly written report, and we ask you to complete this and return it to the school before the Easter break. The Nursery and Reception children will receive their written reports in July. Whether through discussion in person or in the written report, please take note of your child's next steps/ targets – please support us alongside your child to help them progress and feel confident in their learning. Heathfield Youth Group: On Monday 17th March Elm class were visited by Ed Peasgood, a Lead Youth Participation Worker from the Heathfield Youth Hub. The children learnt about the new youth hub, shared their ideas for activities, and helped design ideas for the new sensory and garden spaces.

Heathfield's youth hub is benefitting from a multi-million pound government grant to re-build, with a new multi storey youth hub opening in the autumn of 2025.

The youth hub has free activities for young people aged 10 to 19 living in Wealden, happening after school/in the evenings and during school holidays.

We offer free art, music, games, sport and cooking. We are a supportive figure in children's lives, particularly when it comes to transitions to secondary school, mental health or bullying.
